

BOYS AND GIRLS GOLF

Revised: **June 2026**

Effective: **Sept 2026**

1.0 DATE

The WOSSAA Golf Championships shall be held the week prior to the OFSAA Championship/Festival.

2.0 LOCATION

The location of the Championship shall be determined by that year's WOSSAA Convenor. The Convenorship shall follow a rotation as indicated in the Rotating Calendar of Convenorships (see website).

3.0 EVENTS

3.1 A student-athlete who has competed in a championship governed by a provincial, state or national body within the past twelve (12) months outside of the high school program, shall be classified as an "open" participant within the individual division. For clarification purposes, please refer to the list of championships provided by the OFSAA Golf SAC to the Association Convenors and linked on the OFSAA Golf websites at the beginning of each school year.

3.2 Boys Championship

A one day 18-hole tournament is to be held. Each team will consist of four student athletes.

Huron Perth

3.3 Girls Championship

There will be an "A" Flight and a "B" Flight for student athletes in which to compete. The "A" Flight shall be a one day 18-hole tournament, and the "B" Flight shall be a one-day 9 hole tournament.

- i. Only the "A" Flight student athletes can advance to OFSAA. To qualify to compete in the "A" Flight at WOSSAA, the player must have shot a maximum score of 115 in their Conference Championship.
- ii. To qualify to compete in the "B" Flight, the player must have shot a maximum of double par for nine holes at their Conference Championship.
- iii. Only athletes that have competed at their Conference Championship are eligible to participate at the WOSSAA Championship.

4.0 ENTRY AND ENTRY FEES

4.1 Entries are to be made by the Conference Convenor. It is the responsibility of Conference Convenor to communicate the WOSSAA representatives to the WOSSAA Convenor after the Conference Championship, no later than the next school day.

- 4.2 Entry fees are to be established by the WOSSAA Convenor, to cover the fixed costs of the tournament.
- 4.3 Entry fees are to be paid to the WOSSAA Convenor before the competition begins. Your team or individual student athlete cannot play before entry fees are paid.

5.0 ELIGIBILITY

As per WOSSAA Regulation 3.

6.0 RULES AND OFFICIALS

- 6.1 The rules of golf according to the GAO as of September 1st of the current school year will be followed, as well as any local rules of the hosting club and any local rules made by the Convenor.
- 6.2 The use of spotters that would only help find balls but would not provide any insights on the game itself is permitted.
- 6.3 Caddies will not be permitted for participants. Any coaching/communication with participants will not be permitted on the course. Communication includes, but is not limited to coaches, parents, and spectators. Cell phone use of any kind is not permitted.
- 6.4 Each group will be allocated a designated teacher-supervisor whose purpose is to assist in keeping the group on schedule with respect to pace of play and also to keep the group's score. It is not the expectation of the teacher supervisor to make on course rulings.
- 6.5 Equipment
Caddies and/or motorized carts may be used only by para-athletes or participants with prior medical exemption.
- 6.6 The use of a rangefinder will be permitted, provided that it does not project information about slope.
- 6.7 The WOSSAA Convenor must appoint a Head Official, who is responsible for all decisions regarding the rules of golf. The Head Official for the Championship could be the Club Professional, Assistant Club Professional or a Golf Canada certified official.

7.0 SCORING

- 7.1 Boys Team Championship
The boys team champion shall be determined by the aggregate score of the low 3 scores on each team. In the event of a tie for an OFSAA qualification position, it shall be resolved by all 4 team members playing a one-hole playoff with the winners determined by the lowest aggregate best 3 scores. If a second play-off hole, or more, are necessary, they shall be played under the same parameters. In the event a playoff cannot occur or continue due to darkness, weather, or course availability, the placings will be determined by comparing the final round scorecards of the three (3) lowest total scoring team players. The total scores for each team will be compared on holes 10 – 18, then holes 13 – 18, then holes 16 – 18. If the teams are still tied, then the 4th player's scores will be compared. If the 4th player's scores are tied, then their scorecards will be compared in the identical manner as indicated above.
- 7.2 Boys Individual Championship and Girls A Flight Championship
A tie breaker sudden victory playoff will occur in the event of a tie for an OFSAA qualification position. If a playoff cannot occur or continue due to darkness, weather, or course availability, the individual medal placing will be determined by comparing scorecards from the final round. The winner will be the competitor with the lowest total score on holes 10 – 18. If they are still tied, the winner will be the competitor with the lowest total score on holes 13 – 18. If still tied, the winner will be the competitor with the lowest total score on holes 16 – 18.

7.3 Girls B Flight Championship

The individual medal placing will be determined by comparing scorecards from the final round. The winner will be the competitor with the lowest total score on holes 1 – 9. If they are still tied, the winner will be the competitor with the lowest total score on holes 4 – 9. If still tied, the winner will be the competitor with the lowest total score on holes 7 – 9.

8.0 **UNIFORMS AND EQUIPMENT**

8.1 Uniforms as per the OFSAA Golf Playing Regulations.

8.2 The dress code of the hosting golf course shall be in effect.

9.0 **AWARDS**

9.1 A WOSSAA team plaque will be awarded to the first place boys team.

9.2 Individual medals shall be awarded to first, second and third place team members as well as the coach of each boys team.

9.3 Medals shall be awarded to the first, second and third place individual golfers in the boys Championship.

9.4 Medals shall be awarded to the first, second and third place individual golfers in the A Flight Open, A Flight High School, and B Flight Championships for girls.

10.0 **OFSAA ENTRY**

10.1 According to current OFSAA Playing Regulations.

10.2 **The school of any individuals attending OFSAA will be responsible for paying their OFSAA fees.**
