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Range

There will be a driver range bay for each team for 30 minutes. Information regarding range time will be provided closer to the event. You must be there on time in order to use the range.

WOSSAA Qualifying

WOSSAA qualifying will take place at the TVRA and HP Conference Championships. The Conference Convenor will register participants (including eligibility forms). Each school (team OR individual) must have a coach or walking staff advisor at this CHAMPIONSHIP.

Huron Perth

- 4 teams (4) + coaches = 20
- 2 low individuals + coaches = 4
= 24 total

TVRA Central (London)

- 6 teams (4) + coaches = 30
- 4 low individuals + coaches = 8
= 38 total

TVRA (TriCounty)

- 6 teams (4) + coaches = 30
- 4 low individuals + coaches = 8
= 38 total

Total Number (athletes/coaches) on the course = 100 TOTAL

Cost:

Team Fee - \$400 (four golfers + coach = 5 players)

Individual Fee - \$160 (one golfer + coach = 2 players)

Note: Carts are available for coaches only at a cost of \$28.50 that can be paid at the pro shop.

Payment: One cheque for the entire team (a receipt will be provided that day to each school)

Cheque payable to "Parkside Collegiate Institute"

OFSAA Qualification

This Championship is a qualifier for OFSAA. WOSSAA gets to send one team of 4 and the 2 low individuals (not on that team). More information will be available at WOSSAA.

Media

There will be no special requests made for media personnel. Anyone on the course taking pictures must keep their distance from the players.

Awards

We will present the awards (should take approximately 30 minutes to tally all scorecards).

Note: Players will be able to purchase food and beverage at the course.

Rules and Regulations

Tees: Blues

Rules:

- Unless conditions warrant it, the ball must be played as it lies. Ask the coach for directions if you are not sure what to do.
- No caddying or coaching will be allowed.
- All putts must be holed out – no “gimmies”
- Please maintain a good pace of play. Keep up with the group in Front of you.
- Coaches will keep score for the group. Players should keep their own scorecard but sign the coaches' card once the round has been completed. Once you sign, the score on the card is official and must be submitted to the pro shop.
- We are using the new OOB and Lost Ball rules instead of stroke and distance (was used at OFSAA and is a significant factor in pace of play, especially in the fall)
 - If you hit a ball out of bounds, the drop would be within two club lengths from the edge of the fairway (not the middle). Also the player does have the option of re-teeing but in most cases the 2-stroke penalty is advantageous. This is a 2 STROKE PENALTY.
 - Example: Tee shot ball (1), lose ball and drop in fairway (2 and 3), hit ball from fairway (4)... you will be hitting your fourth shot from the fairway.

Playoff Hole(s)

- **Playoff Holes -- Hole 1 | Hole 18 | Hole 1 | Hole 9 | if necessary start back at Hole 1**

Spotters

- There will be a spotter on Hole 2, 3, 11, 14, and Hole 15/16 hill to help with visuals on tee shots

Range Finders

- Cell phones are not permitted
- Range finders must have slope turned off

Rules Officials

- There will be multiple officials roaming the course if there are any issues with rulings
- If there is a rules dispute, Golf Professional Jake Adams and Ryan King will be making final decisions on the day of the event.

Course Maintenance

- Players all must fix divots on the greens
- Players must rake the sand trap once they have hit their shot
- Players must put in the pin at the end of the hole
- NOTE: this is NOT the coaches/scorers responsibility

Meal (NOT INCLUDED IN FEE)

- Half way hut will be open for basic concession stand foods to be purchased

NEW - Classification of HIGH SCHOOL vs OPEN

Effective September 1, 2025:

A student-athlete who has competed in a championship governed by a provincial, state or national body within the past twelve (12) months outside of the high school program, shall be classified as an “open” participant within the individual division. For clarification purposes, please refer to the list of championships provided by the OFSAA Golf SAC to the association convenors and linked on the OFSAA Golf websites at the beginning of each school year. If the student-athlete has participated in one or more of the following championships within the past twelve months, they will be declared an “Open” golfer and participate in the “Open” Division:

- GAO Ontario Men’s/Women’s Amateur Championship
- GAO Ontario Men’s/Women’s Match Play Championship
- GAO Ontario Junior Boys’/Girls’ Amateur Championship
- GAO Ontario Junior Boys’/Girls’ Match Play Championship
- GAO Ontario U15 Championship
- GAO Ontario U17 Championship
- GAO Ontario U19 Championship
- CJGA Mizuno National Junior Golf Championship
- CJGA Ping Canadian Junior Match Play Championship
- Golf Canada Canadian Junior Boys’/Girls’ Championship
- Golf Canada Canadian Men’s/Women’s Championship
- Any US Junior State Championship
- US Junior Girls’ Championship
- US Junior Amateur Championship

If you only participated in the Ontario Summer Games, you may still be considered a “High School” division golfer.
